Message from the chairperson



A YEAR OF GROWTH FOR THE READING SEED

To our wonderful supporters and friends,

What an amazing year The Reading Seed has had and definitely a year of growth for us in so many aspects.

Our Remedial Teaching Project continued with tutoring for 7 students living in The Village of Joy in South Africa. This is having some very positive results with the children involved. We have changed tutoring agencies due to costs and are currently using Saving Grace Junior Tutors, whom we are very happy with. The founder and tutor, Damilola is great with the children, keeps great communication with us and is making improvements.

The Further Studies Project saw Siphokazi complete her studies and international exam at the end of 2016 and gain full time employment. A MAJOR SUCCESS for this project as she is the first recipient of this project to finish and obtain work.

In January a student at The Village of Joy, Lungile became the next recipient for this project. Passionate about fashion she started a fashion course. She was doing extremely well but unfortunately left The Village, meaning The Reading Seed could no longer support her. This was very sad news for us but we have no control over the situation at the children's home. We hope Lungile will continue to pursue her studies on her own accord

Our School Support Project through The Charity Club in Malaysia, supported 6 students with sponsorship to pay for school fees, uniforms and other resources needed. One of our recipients had a complete turn around from rarely getting to school to being elected a school prefect! Another student received the chance to pursue her studies at a boarding school in Malaysia.

Our membership program, which was established at the end of 2015/2016 financial year has continued to grow and become established, with valuable individuals as volunteers and members. To date we have 32 members on a members base of trustworthy, valuable people.

Over the course of the year we have had some great fund raising campaigns including our continuing Brave the Dare Campaign that sees the board members be nominated to complete a dare and in the process raise \$500. Justin has absolutely blown everyone out of the water bu raising over \$1500 for his cycling dare around Perth in a Santa suit on a hot summer day! Great job Justin as well as our other board members!

Our fund raising committee was officially set up and this has seen some great ideas and campaigns for fund raising and we will continue to op

This had put The Reading Seed in a position where we have been able to take on another charity have also been so excited to take on our 3rd charity, La Buena Esperanza , a small school in Lima, Peru that was set up to optimise learning in children from these areas. They do not receive government support and so funding and resources are limited. We will be taking on more projects but in this financial year we were able approve The English book project which involved the donation of English books to assist in the school's English program.

We continued to comply with regulations set by the Australian Charities and Non profit Commission. We also set up a child protection and anti-terrorism policy to ensure that the registered charities or agencies we are partnering with, do take the protection and well being of the children seriously and that the much needed funds The Reading Seed is sending to these children is definitely getting there.

None of this amazing work would have been possible if we didn't have our wonderful members and volunteers who donated their time and expertise to help with our events and fundraisers purely for the purpose to raise funds for the kids we support all around the world. Lastly thank you to the members of the board who have always given their time and guidance to allow The Reading Seed to achieve its objectives and grow.

As we continue to expand we have to remember that we are just a small charity, started by a group of people wanting to make a difference in the world. We do this because we want to, not for a salary and I believe this attitude sets us apart from others.

In the four years of operation The Reading Seed has raised much needed donations for under-privileged children to have the chance to better themselves through education, eventually creating sustainability within families and communities.

2013 - FOUNDING

The Reading Seed was set up by founders, Emma and Daniel Bales, after living in South Africa for three years and seeing the effects of poor situations mixed with poor education. They knew they had to do something and so after hours of research they set up a charity which resonated the values and goals they want to achieve, along with their brilliant team on the board, a constitution decided upon and The Reading Seed was borne.

2014 – ONE CHARITY TWO PROJECTS

The Reading Seed started supporting the children from a children's home, The Village in South Africa first with 2 different projects: The Remedial Teaching Project and The Further Studies Project. Funding was allocated program to help those children 'catch up' and learn foundational skills needed for learning that had not been taught. We also supported a student to study at university.

2015 – TWO CHARITIES THREE PROJECTS

Obligations were complied with from the Australian Charities and Non-Profit Commission as well as meeting the needs of the children supported through the programs set up., including Brain Gain.

Unfortunately the student we supported at university left the care of The Village and so we had to cease funding.

Siphokazi became the recipient of The Further Studies Project to commence a vocational course in beauty.

2016 - TWO CHARITIES THREE PROJECTS


The highlight of this year was the partnership established with The Charity Club in Langkawi, Malaysia. This charity helps those in need on the island of Langkawi and so the School Support Project was started to help get some of these kids to school. The money raised goes to uniforms, school fees, books and lunches for the children.

Siphokazi finished her studies.

2017 - THREE CHARITIES FOUR PROJECTS

Siphokazi gained employment at a very reputable salon in Johannesburg and is now supporting herself!

At the end of June a third charity was taken on, La Buena Esperanza in Lima, Peru to start The English Book Project. English books were donated to this small school and will be used to assist in the school's English program.





In 2017/2018 we will be supporting 3 charities in 3 different continents with over 6 projects.

The Reading Seed's long term objectives were and are to:


- be a reputable presence amongst the community and hav our registered charities and agencies we work with

Continue with transparent reporting of costs and activities of The Reading Seed, including regular audits and ongoing company and charity registrations




The Reading Seed was founded with two basic and clear objectives that spell out why we are here:

2. To provide a connection between Australians and those in need and promote a culture of philanthropy

2016/2017 was our fourth year of operations and another very solid year for The Reading Seed in which we maintained strong support for our existing projects at Changing Lives Ministries in South Africa and with The Charity Club Langkawi in Malaysia.

Furthermore, due to our strong financial position, strong fund raising and support from our members, we were able to take on a new charity, La Buena Esperanza, in Peru when the opportunity came up.

A total of \$13,074 was raised in the financial year, including \$9,487 of income and \$3,587 of non-cash donations. We are 100% volunteer run and once again The Reading Seed achieved its key objective to ensure that every dollar donated is a dollar delivered to our projects, with only 3% of the donated funds spent on administration costs - mainly international transfer fees.

The Reading Seed is committed to its members in acting as an open and transparent organisation and we have again had our financials audited to ensure we maintain the best possible governance processes and ensure we gain the trust of sponsors to grow in the future.

We would like to sincerely thank the team at Australian Audit for donating their professional services in completing an audit of our activities for the 2016/17 year.

This year we have made the following contributions;

1. Changing Lives Ministries (CLM) in South Africa;

<u>Remedial Teaching</u> – TRS donated \$5,320 towards remedial teaching aids and tutoring to assist children struggling at school.

<u>Further Studies Scholarship</u> – TRS donated \$609 towards Beauty Therapy training for Siphokazi, who graduated at the end of 2016. We look forward to supporting further students through this project in the future.

1. The Charity Club Langkawi

<u>School Support Project</u>- TRS donated \$2,229 to support 6 underprivileged kids from Langkawi to attend school

A summary of The Reading Seeds financials for the 2016/17 year is shown in the table below, and further details on our financials can be found in the auditor's report.

The Reading Seed has again finished the year with a strong balance sheet leaves which allows us to commit to the ongoing support of existing projects in the year ahead. This effort will again be supported by our fund raising and membership committees that were established in 2016.

We thank all those that supported The Reading Seed this year, and look forward to your support well into the future.




